#### Understanding Architecture Study Day Thursday, 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2020 at Benson Parish Hall, Sunnyside, Benson, OX10 6LZ

The aim of this day is to inform members how to "read" buildings, how to understand what they are seeing and what it symbolises; and to also provide a brief history of architectural progress from 18th century to modern times. It is hoped that this will enrich their future travels at home and abroad.

We are very fortunate to have Dr Geoffrey Tyack, FSA, FRHistS as our speaker for the entire day. He is a Fellow emeritus of Kellogg College, and President of the Oxfordshire Architectural and Historical Society. He has many publications to his credit and copious experience teaching groups of all ages. Today's lectures will be 45 minutes in length, copiously illustrated with photographs, and allowing 15 minutes for questions after each presentation.

# CARTOON APPRECIATION COURSE



A short 6-week course of cartoon comedy, wit and satire. *Thursdays: 10:30 −12:30 a.m.* May 7th, 14th, 21st and 28th. June: 4th and 11th.

During each 2-hour class we shall explore the methods and tools used by certain artists to ridicule, mock and lampoon groups, organisations or celebrities via the medium of cartoons and caricatures, and we shall also question: "why do they do it?"

The committed cartoonist may simply have the desire to make people laugh, to make a specific point, to attack individuals from the historical past, the present, or anticipate a future event or merely want to throw general cartoons into the daily swirl of publication. Oh, yes, without doubt cartooning is very exciting, covers a broad church, is sometimes dangerous and can be very well-paid.

This appreciation course is no talking shop; this is a hands-on, think-for- yourself series of lessons in which you will get to understand what is entailed in creating that 'Knock 'em dead' result. Also, where appropriate, we shall observe and discuss famous past and present cartoonists' cartoons and explore their methodology.




#### Sew Happy Crew!

## **Open Meeting - IT Help Desk**


There is normally an opportunity both before and after the Open Meetings to seek assistance with IT problems and using the MK U3A website, including setting up your login and password and updating your personal profile.

When available it's offered before the meeting from 2:00pm and after the meeting until 4.15pm but please check the Open Meeting confirmation email to confirm it will be available on the day.


Free Wi-Fi is available at the venue.

#### Welcome to Charity Recycling MK

Our aim is to reduce the volume of domestic plastics sent to landfill or incineration and use it instead, thanks to sponsorship, to raise money for charity.

My name is George Thomson, a TerraCycle UK approved drop-off point administrator. I function on a totally voluntary basis and receive no paym ent of any kind, so 100% of all funds raised are shared between Willen Hospice and MK Cat Rescue. I'm retired these days so doing this gives me the chance to 'put something back'.

Our original focus was on Tassimo discs and wrappers. They remain the mainstay of the operation, but these days we also handle Nespresso L'Or pods, Kenco wrappers and instant jar lids, biscuit wrappers of all kinds, trigger spray guns, surface wipe packaging as well as dental care and air freshener products.

Even more recently we have been able to include crisp bags and similar materials, pet food pouches and bags and Ella's Kitchen baby food pouches, all which have generated a flood of interest.

You will easily spot our drop-off crate at 25 Cantle Avenue, Downs Barn MK14 7RJ where it's available 24/7. Free carrier bags are also provided as are information leaflets.

Most Willen Hospice Charity Shops now have collection boxes, something I am extremely grateful for. Unfortunately Willen shops are



unable to accept wet pet food pouches, but everything else is welcome.

Recycling and charity cash distribution are managed by TerraCycle UK and the scheme is sponsored by the various product manufacturers.

I hope I can count on your support.

#### Dear Concert-Goer

Vivaldi, McDowall and Telemann - Saturday 28 March 2020, St Mary's, Woburn, 7.30 pm

At our March concert, the Danesborough Chorus looks forward to taking you on an adventure in musical contrasts, with Baroque masterpieces by Vivaldi and Telemann, and

a contemporary classic by Cecilia McDowall.

Vivaldi's music was forgotten after his death in 1741. Fortunately, his *Gloria* — a joyful, warm hymn of praise and worship — was rescued from obscurity in 1939 to become a much-loved work in the choral repertoire. His less well-known *Magnificat* offers dramatic, highly infectious music to delight all fans of the Baroque.

Telemann's *Suite in D* is taken from his collection of *Tafelmusik*, German for the custom of entertaining guests at meals with background instrumental music. Telemann wrote: "I do hope this work will one day contribute to my fame". Its dazzling duets for oboe and trumpets, its lightness of spirit, and tuneful melodies that suit perfectly each instrument ensure Telemann would not feel disappointed.

In 2014, Cecilia McDowall won the British Composer Award for Choral Music. Her hauntingly beautiful *Ave Maris Stella* is an anthem to peace and was first performed in Portsmouth Cathedral on Armistice Day 2001. You can look forward to tranquil purity, with occasional dissonant harmonies, from a composer whose 'communicative gift is very rare in modern music' (*International Record Review*).

For this Spring concert we're joined by the Alina Orchestra and soloists Susan Gilmore Bailey (soprano) and Anna Huntley (mezzo).

I enclose a flyer with full details and a booking form (see over) so that you can order tickets: £20 and £15 (centre, reserved); £10 (aisles, unreserved); under-18s £5 (all areas). We look forward to welcoming you on Saturday 28 March, the eve of British Summer Time.
