Members Meeting and talks

Sadly, what was to be our final "live" talk of the year was postponed due to an illness within the speaker's family. We were however very fortunate in our ZOOM talk this month. Peter Carney shared with us an insight to "The End of the Roman Empire" how and why it happened and what was myth and what could be supported by evidence. We learned how the Goths needed to migrate westward within Europe due to climate change and how this shifted the power, priorities and dynamic of the Roman Empire. How changes and different power shifts led to a dismantling of the bureaucratic class with the subsequent loss of ability to raise taxes and support economic well being and how recent excavations of bodies buried as the empire ended showed people were both dying young and showing evidence of chronic ill health. Again, Peter shared with us his expert knowledge in an entertaining and accessible manner.

We currently have one more event scheduled for this year:

Talk 1 (The first of the Charity's next financial year) Wednesday 15th December: "Festive Verse" shared with us and delivered by Simon Gregor. This talk is via ZOOM.

Itinerary:-

Day 1: 8am pick-up at Milton Keynes Coachway M16 Travel to Exeter (190 miles), stopping en route at Montacute House Gardens (<u>montacute@nationaltrust.org.uk</u>). This glittering Elizabethan mansion is adorned with riches that exude wealth and power and the compartmentalised gardens are quite unique.

Lunch can be taken here before resuming our journey to Exeter and our hotel in the centre of the city.

Day 2: Exeter Cathedral/Killerton House: Depart hotel on foot to meet our guide at Exeter Cathedral for a guided tour at 11am followed by free time in the city. In the afternoon travel by coach to nearby Killerton House (killerton@nationaltrust.org.uk). Following our visit we return to Exeter with time to relax before dinner.

Day 3: Eden Project: Departing after breakfast we travel south into the county of Cornwall to visit the famous Eden Project. Housing plants and landscapes from the Tropics, Mediterranean, South Africa and California in its huge Biomes, this unique feature opened in 1998 on the site of a former china clay quarry and continues to attract visitors from all over the world.
