

Tales Tattled & Told – storytelling by and for adults

Once upon a time, a group of people were drawn together by a love of stories - myths, fables, tall tales and even a bit of history. If you are looking for something a little bit different, why not try an evening of performance storytelling by and for adults at the Rectory Cottages in Bletchley?

Tales Tattled & Told is a storytelling collective based in Milton Keynes. Professional storytellers and occasional poets bring original works, traditional folktales, fascinating fables and personal remembrances at 7:30 pm every third Saturday of the month.

Tales Tattled & Told began its fourth season on 17 September 2022 with stories from Commonwealth countries and personal reminiscences in honour of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II. Bedfringe Festival sell-out Mark Steinhardt headlined the evening with the Irish folktale 'Lord Benbow,' a story of young love and personal loyalty.

On 15 October, Lichfield storyteller Janet Crouch headlines with original stories of the North. She will be joined by local tellers Stephen Hobbs, Peter Boyce and Lynette Hill. Finishing the night with a flourish will be the a capella choir Gracenotes.

Tickets for Tales Tattled & Told are £6 on-line through WeGotTickets.com and £8 at the door.

Are you interested in giving storytelling a go yourself? Excellent! Come join our StoryCircle, which takes place every other Thursday evening. StoryCircle is an informal group of friendly and like-minded folk who come together to share stories, poetry, or even rehearse business presentations in a relaxed setting. Any type of spoken word can be shared for up to ten minutes. Participants must speak their piece - no reading allowed during the actual presentation.

Regular StoryCircle sessions will begin on 13 October and continue every other Thursday thereafter. These sessions are free (with tea and coffee provided). A £3 donation to help cover the hire of the room is appreciated but not required.

All events take place at the Rectory Cottages, 49 Church Green Rd, Bletchley, Milton Keynes MK3 6BJ. Doors open at 7 pm for a 7:30 start. Parking is free on Church Green Road and nearby. The Cottages are a short walk from Bletchley railway station. The Arriva bus stop is just across the street.
